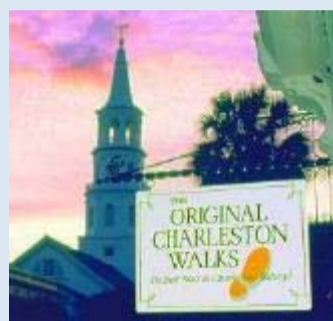

Music City Jazz & Heritage Festival combines local and national jazz and blues talent for one spectacular Labor Day weekend.

Music is Only Half the Fun - Nashville boasts many cultural attractions such as the Frist Center for the Visual Arts. The Frist Center for the Visual Arts is a nonprofit art-exhibition center, with approximately 24,000 square feet of gallery space, dedicated to presenting the finest visual art from local, state and regional artists, as well as major U.S. and international exhibitions. The Nashville Opera, as well as the Nashville Symphony perform year round and a new world-class concert hall, slated to open in 2006, will feature many musical performances. Nashville's many wonderful restaurants specialize in Southern cuisine with a flare. The city also attracts sports lovers for Titans' football, golf and Predators' hockey.

The Athens of the South - The moniker 'Athens of the South' has helped foster Nashville's reputations as a cultural and learning destination. Over 150 years ago, the first of many colleges in the area raised the bar on education in the south. Today there are more than 16 colleges and universities in the area. Because of the city's dedication to learning, many cultural institutions have made Nashville their home. The Family Side of Nashville - Nashville offers something for the whole family. Nashville was recently voted one of the friendliest cities in the country, which makes families feel right at home. The Adventure Science Museum, the Nashville Zoo at Grassmere, Art Quest at the Frist Center for the Visual Arts and the Valley Fair Amusement Park are just a few places with family friendly activities.
